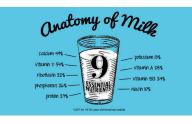

Dairy is a simple and delicious way to get the important nutrients your body needs. Milk is often known for the calcium it provides, but there are nine essential nutrients in milk that contribute to key functions and processes in your body, including: protein, calcium, vitamin D, riboflavin, phosphorus, potassium, vitamin A, vitamin B12, and niacin. In addition, milk is made up of 85% water, making it hydrating as well as nutritious. **Dietary Guidelines** for Americans recommend three servings of low-fat or fat-free milk or milk products every day. 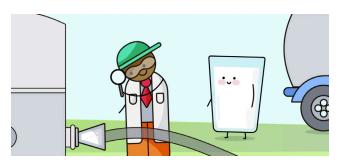
